



Call for Applicants: Documentary Photography Fellowship

Title: Documentary Photography Fellow

Anticipated dates of service: 12 weeks (180 hours; 15 hours per week)

Location: Remote; Estimated 30-40% travel

Monthly stipend: \$1,536.34

Project Background:

The Latinx Preservation Advocacy Toolkit will be the first of its kind! The toolkit will be a print and digital booklet that will demystify historic preservation and empower our communities and provide access to information traditionally not shared with historic Latinx communities. The Toolkit will be accompanied by a series of short, bilingual videos that explore the processes and consequences of historic preservation, highlight Latinx heritage conservation success stories throughout the country, and provide guidance and advice on how to preserve history and communities throughout the state. The toolkit will be an educational bilingual (English and Spanish) resource that will help Latinx community members and organizations in urban and rural areas advocate for the protection of Latinx historic sites and other tangible or intangible heritage resources. In doing so, we will help promote inclusion in historic preservation by creating and widely distributing and accessible toolkit.

- Ability to travel to an airport
- Studies and/or experience in Photography, art, film, or a related field

- Experience with documentary photography
- Uses camera as a method of storytelling
